Field Trips

Meet at the Information Booth just inside the Humble Civic Center front entrance 15 minutes ahead of departure times.

8:00: Friday, September 26 - Whiskey Bridge

Maps will be included in the information packets picked up at registration. This is a “type-locality” for mid-Eocene invertebrate fossils. Vehicles will caravan to the site where you will meet your trip leader, Owen Martin. It’s about a 2-hour drive from HCC to the Brazos River bridge at Hwy 21. Owen’s cell phone # is 713-591-1529.

10:30: Sunday, September 28 - Houston Museum of Natural Sciences Tour and HGMS Clubhouse Tour.

Museum Tour will include the permanent exhibits on gemstones and minerals as well as the special exhibit “Dinosaur Mummy CSI: Cretaceous Science Investigation.” If 20 people or more sign up for the tour, the discount price is \$9; if fewer than 20 sign up, each must pay full admission price of \$15. There is a McDonald’s in the museum, or you may pack a lunch. Vehicles will caravan to the site.

After the Museum tour, you have two choices. You may return directly to the Humble Civic Center, or you may go to the HGMS Clubhouse for a tour of our facilities and then back to the HCC. Light refreshments will be available at the clubhouse. See maps that will be in your info packets.
